



## Wilhelmina Emma Ives

June 29, 1918 - June 18, 2018

Indian Valley native Wilhelmina Emma Ives peacefully passed from this life early Monday morning, June 18, 2018 at California Park Rehabilitation Hospital located in Chico, CA just days shy of her 100th birthday.

Born in Genesee, CA June 29, 1918 to the late California natives Jack and Polly (Majors) Peters she was raised and educated in Indian Valley spending her entire life here. As a LVN she worked for the Plumas County Health Department as well as Enloe Medical Center in Chico, CA.

Wilhelmina was a devout Christian who was a member of the Indian Mission Full Gospel Church, and taught Bible Study at a number of other local churches in the community. Proud of her native American Heritage she was a member of the Tusidem Tribe and was the last surviving elder fluent in their language. She took great pride in passing on the language to the youth of the tribe.

Wilhelmina enjoyed passing her leisure time gardening, sewing, especially crocheting, painting in water colors and watching Westerns.

In her passing she leaves her daughter; Clara Ives of Chico, five grand and eight great grandchildren.

She is preceded in her passing by her husband Douglas in 1959, brothers; Hopkins, Miles and William,, sister; Clara and two precious grandchildren.

A Wake will take place starting at 5:00PM Friday evening, June 29, 2018 and continuing until the time of her Celebration of Life at 11:00AM Saturday, June 30, 2018 all at the Indian Mission Full Gospel Church in Greenville, CA. Interment will take place in the Chico Jim Native American Cemetery in Greenville, CA.
